Step by Step

DIR.: ELIZA KUBARSKA, MICHAŁ WOROCH • DOC.

Michał, who has spinal muscular atrophy (SMA) and uses a wheelchair, embarks on a challenging expedition to the Himalayas. At 36, after 15 years in a wheelchair, he draws mental strength from travel, despite the toll on his health. His disease is progressively weakening him, and he fears being fully dependent on others one day. Joined by Paralympic athlete Bartosz Mrozek, they aim to cross the steep Annapurna trail, facing cold, high bridges, and the Thorung Pass (5,416 m). Michał documents the journey, which reveals friendship and determination against the breathtaking backdrop of the world's highest mountains.



Who is Roman Polański? A wonderful artist with everlasting fame. The outlaw, marked by the fate of the public aura of extreme oppositions – idolatrous almost worship and hateful invective of the heaviest caliber. The film is an attempt to face his phenomenon.

There's Nothing to Fear

This project explores the evolving perceptions of death and the funeral industry, blending lightness with a profound topic. With death often seen as taboo or a scare tactic in modern culture, we aim to tell a fresh, reflective story that balances tradition with emerging trends.

The Death of Our Mother

A deeply emotional and universal story about loss, family bonds, and art as a tool for reconciliation. The film focuses on the death of Olga Sipowicz, known as Kora, one of the most influential figures in the Polish music scene, who passed away in 2018.

Unheard. The Story of Sarsa

The film's main protagonist is Marta Markiewicz, known as Sarsa, a Polish music artist who is battling otosclerosis, a condition that leads to hearing loss. Through her personal story, Sarsa touches on themes that are both universal and deeply human, making this film particularly valuable on many levels.

Rami is an Israeli, and Bassam is a Palestinian, both lost their daughters – Smadar died in a Jerusalem suicide bombing and Abir was shot by an Israeli soldier. Their shared grief forged an enduring friendship and a common mission for peace. The film follows their journey as they share their stories across Israel, Palestine, and the world. Through memories, family conversations, and archival footage, we explore two families divided by conflict but united by loss, seeking to inspire dialogue and healing.

The World Is Not (a) Mine

DIR.: NATALIA KONIARZ • DOC.

Natalia Koniarz's feature debut reveals the harsh realities of life around Bolivia's Cerro Rico, the oldest silver mine where 8 million miners have perished since the 16th century. Juvenal (13), Hoper (40), and Claudia (25) are bound to this collapsing mountain, earning just enough to survive, deprived of labor rights and state support. Miners rarely live past 35 in good health, while children like Juvenal work to support their families. Women are destined to guard the mines and work relentlessly while risking their selfhood. This film explores a world united by death, where hope is scarce, and exploitation never ends.



DIR.: MICHAŁ BIELAWSKI • DOC.

The most neglected aspect of climate change are human emotions. Group of people, under the supervision of experienced therapist Zbigniew Miłuński, talk about their helplessness and anger caused by the end of the known World. In the workshops participate climate activists, photographer, film director, miner and farmer. Film reveals therapeutic process and follows characters in the moments of their privacy, it includes also creative sequences about human's exploitation of the Earth. For the characters, the workshop becomes an emotional roller-coaster. Eventually they will find the strength that the support group can offer. That path may help them finding the balance without which no one will be able to live in the future.

December

December brings exceptional spells of cold and snowfall to Europe. The existing order is destroyed not only by the harsh weather, but also by 'strangers' who want to get into the territory of the European Union. Some people try to live as if nothing has changed and get ready for approaching Christmas. Others join the battle and, depending on their views, they either fight with the 'strangers,' or try to save their lives. This is December: a documentary manifesto made up of a number of mini stories set somewhere between empathy and indifference. Thirty-one autonomous chapters, create a mosaic that is a mirror image of ourselves. *December* is a creative documentary which focuses on the contemporary perception of migrants from the Middle East and Africa.

Dekonstrukt

DIR.: MATEUSZ GÓRA, KAMIL WILK • DOC.

Stefa, Mac and Karo, three non-binary artists, founded an art and party collective called 'Dekonstrukt'. The initiative is run by and aimed at transgender people. They are looking for ways to express their aesthetics and find an appropriate channel for the radical art they create. Meanwhile protagonists face final exams at the Academy of Fine Arts and need to decide how to handle their adult lives. At times, this documentary coming-of-age story will transform into a punk road movie, where protagonists set out on a journey, facing their problems by playing their confident on-screen alter egos.
