DIR. TOMASZ WYSOKIŃSKI

A hero of the fight against apartheid is looking for a baby abducted in the township of Soweto. The search leads him to the dark places of Johannesburg and the painful spaces of his soul.

Every day, a great many children disappear in South Africa. They run away from home or are kicked out by troubled relatives. Some are abducted for child trafficking or prostitution, others are being ritually murdered. A man named Jerry is single-handedly searching for them. In Walk with Angels, we follow him on his mission to find a baby kidnapped from Soweto. The ancestral spirits say that the girl is still alive, but warn that finding the child could result in her mother's death. The search opens Jerry's old wounds and brings back painful memories - his early life in the streets, being recruited as a child soldier by the military arm of the ANC, and his heroic fight against the apartheid regime. The confrontation with the past reveals Jerry's true soul.

Tomasz Wysokiński director

Medicine was a mistake. Fortunately, one day I set out on the first two-year iourney around Asia, which changed my life. It was an illumination – I saw the path I wanted to follow. I have visited over fifty countries of the Third World, and I would like to use my experiences from the last dozen years of traveling to create feature documentary films about the inaccessible worlds, whose existence almost no one knows about, and perhaps no one ever will... At the moment, while planning my new travels and coming up with a topic for my new documentary film, I focus on writing a script from a short story by Jorge Luis Borges.

Piotr Kobus PRODUCER

Piotr Kobus (1971, Poland) graduated with a degree in management and international marketing from Pace University, New York and completed post-graduate studies in Intellectual Property Law at the University of Warsaw. He attended the EAVE Producers Workshop and The European Film Academy Master Class in Sound Design.

AP MAÑANA founded in 2021 by Piotr Kobus, distributed more than 50 films by eminent authors of world cinema. In 2010 he founded, with Agnieszka Drewno, Mañana Ltd as production arm of a distribution company. Mañana's mission is to develop outstanding feature fiction and documentary films for cinema in co-production with foreign partners. Lasting (Poland-Spain) directed by Jacek Borcuch won CINEMATOGRAPHY AWARD at 2013 SUNDANCE. *United States of Love* (Poland-Sweden) by Tomasz Wasilewski won SILVER BEAR at BERLINALE 2016. Satan Said Dance (Poland-Netherlands) by Kasia Rosłaniec premiered at SXSW 2017 and won awards in Hamburg, Kraków and Valencia.







DIR. JOANNA JANIKOWSKA

In Comrades three young Italians who believe that communism can repair their country, and possibly the entire world, must face their growing pains. A politically engaged "coming of age" film.

Bologna, an Italian university city where the young dance wildly in the streets, while families are evicted from illegally occupied buildings. It is also home to the film's three protagonists: Simone, Francesca, and Olivia, young members of the Communist Refoundation Party. Despite different personalities and backgrounds, they participate in demonstrations, meetings, and support each other. They search for ways to organize the world, find work, and help them feel like a part of a community. However, senior Party members are only concerned with the past, sabotaging any attempts to change. Their disenchantment with the Party coincides with personal crises. Simone's sense of helplessness, the death of Francesca's beloved grandmother, and Olivia's contempt for the Party's inefficiency make them drift away from the organization and each other. Simone returns from this period of solitude through music, hosting a reggae festival. Francesca takes up painting. An exhibition of her works culminates her mourning, providing a summary of her reflections on the future. Olivia, impatient with her colleagues' inertia, joins a left-wing militia but soon finds out that she is involved with dangerous people. When the trio meets again, they have little in common. Cooperation is not possible. The revolution isn't coming.

Mastered the art of filmmaking as assistant director, collaborating with Piotr Stasik (21x New York, European Film Award nominee, and Opera about Poland) and Jacek Raginis-Królikiewicz (A Glance). Janikowska developed her full-length documentary debut Comrades as part of Doc Lab Poland and Women Doc Circle Accelerator. A long-time associate of Docs Against Gravity film festival.

Awarded as the best producer at Era New Horizons International Film Festival (2008) and Krakow Film Festival (2017), Co-owner and chairwoman at KIJORA FILM. A group of young men gives up on their existing lives and enters the Dominican Novitiate. What are they looking for? Spirituality? Life's purpose? Community? Change?

We are in the Dominican convent. Novices try to adapt to the seemingly monotonous monastic way of life, which is based on rituals. We focus on two protagonists. Wojtek is sensitive and a bit melancholic. Julek, a faithful football fan, cannot give up on the active and social lifestyle he used to have. Novices learn their duties, but more importantly, they form new friendships. They start to open up and confess to each other. They share their doubts about their faith in God and wonder whether the convent is the way they should follow. They miss their families and friends. They miss sexual contacts.

At first, Julek cannot find himself in the world full of restricted rules, but with the passage of time he starts to discover his vocation. Wojtek misses the world outside the convent's walls more and more. Monastic rituals set the rhythm of the story. We see that for some novices letting go of their relationships, professional careers and everyday pleasures becomes a chance to open up to new experiences. However, it is the disturbances of the monastic reality that become most important in "The Novice". A difficult phone call from the family. A letter from a girl. Is the convent a right place to solve personal problems? For whom the monastic life will become their life's journey?

"The Novice" is a story about the search for life's purpose. It is also a story about giving up on a path that seemed to be leading to it.

A spokesman of the communist government in the 1980ties, Jerzy Urban, has now chosen the Internet to take on nationalism and the clerical right in no uncertain terms, proving himself an unlikely and controversial ally in the fight for the liberal order. Urban is the ultimate spinner, a devil and a poison dwarf of communism. After being prominent in the public space over seven decades, he's as active as ever in challenging authority and bringing to light hard truths, not least by pranking and provoking his youngest and most active audience. The film will useUrban's online world to pose contemporary questions like who do we trust in a world of competing truth sand narratives? Are there any limits to free speech? How does Facebook/YT change the way we engage with politics? The story is centered on how Urban - the oldest Youtuber in Poland - is using what he learned as the former head of the communist propaganda machine and taking it up a gear to become an Internet sensation among the young generation entering political life. He engages with hundreds of thousands of fans - and enemies - through his social media presence, all with his usual flair and thick-skinned, unwavering focus. In satirical and shocking short video commentaries he gets to the heart of the issues that truly matter today. The Ultimate Joker is a feature documentary film where Urban's online presence becomes a trigger for a conversation reflecting the modern, digital era. We focus on the man himself, his relentless creativity, his ability to survive the twists and turns of fate, and his capacity for constant self-re-invention. We have exclusive access to Urban and his private family archive of photographs and documents.

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DIR. JAŚMINA WÓJCIK

King Matt the First advocates preserving childhood, acknowledging the very essence of humaneness in children, trusting them and appreciating their openness and needs.

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The creative documentary records the journey of two sisters – Lea and Zoja. They read the novel "King Matt The First" by Janusz Korczak, which tells the story of a young boy, who becomes king after his father dies and addresses such issues as the experience of war, betrayal, death, loneliness or injustice. The book inspires them to explore nature at first, but then they give up the plot in favor of uninhibited play. The two are the audience's guides in the world of childhood. The viewers join them in sound, choreography and art workshops where the children discover various ways to express themselves with the body, sound, rhythm, motor activities and sensorics. In the movie it's the children who are in charge and control the entire process. Adults, on the other hand, simply follow them without interfering. They stand aside, which lets them better understand and learn their world. Thus, the traditional roles are swapped in the movie: it's adults who learn from children and not the other way round.

A heartwarming story about a resolute 8-year-old girl exploring the world with her globetrotting father and growing up in an unconventional family.

Lili (8) and her dad, Tomek are avid travelers. They have already crossed half of Norway, where they live as well as Romania, Georgia, Iceland and France. As the film's narrator, Lili introduces the viewer to the world of her vivid imagination. When not traveling, she goes to school and divides her time equally between her mom and dad's homes. Because her parents have started new relationships with partners, who also have children, Lili is constantly surrounded by people. Nonetheless, she is sometimes haunted by a sense of loneliness, uncertainty or fear. New questions and doubts arise in the girl's head when Lili's mother tells her about little baby sister they will welcome in a few months.

Sylwia Rosak DIRECTOR

A graduate of the M.A. program at the Directing Department (Krzysztof Kieślowski Faculty of Radio and Television, Katowice). She has worked alongside Oscar nominated directors – Bartosz Konopka and Aneta Kopacz. In her work, she focuses most on the inner world her protagonists build within themselves. By dressing them in an interesting visual form, she creates auteur cinema. The short films she has made so far have successfully travelled around the world.

Katarzyna Kuczyńska executive producer

She graduated from Lodz Film School and a Creative Producers course at the Wajda School. For years, she gathered experience working on fiction films (*The Model* by Mads Matthiesen, *Zud* by Marta Minorowicz, *The Mute* by Bartosz Konopka) and documentaries (*Communion* by Anna Zamecka, *Chronicle Of Love In The Warsaw Ghetto By Marek Edelman* by Jolanta Dylewska and Andrzej Wajda, among others). Since 2019 she has been developing documentary and fiction projects at HAKA FILMS.

HAKA FILMS is a production company focused on artistic productions as well as commercial content (TV ads and shows). Its goal is to produce deep, moving documentaries with protagonists of flesh and blood as well as thrilling fiction films based on amazing scripts and produced with highest care. The company currently has 3 documentaries in development: *Lili* by Sylwia Rosak, *Boylesque* by Bogna Kowalczyk and *One for the Team* by Katarzyna Wiśniowska.





DIR. RADKA FRANCZAK

An extraordinary woman who broke the social rules and limitations that bound a poor girl born in Eastern Europe in 1858 and became one of the greatest singers of her times.

Marcella Sembrich, Prakseda Kochańska, Bozio, Marcella Stengel – these are the artistic pseudonyms of one woman. Johann Strauss said of her "she is the greatest solo artist of our time". But today, hardly anyone knows who she was. The memory of the outstanding Polish artist did not survive – not even in her own family. Her admirers and friends with whom she corresponded included Verdi, Rachmaninov, Brahms, Mahler, Puccini, Thomas Edison, Mark Twain, Otto von Bismarck, Ignacy Paderewski, Henryk Sienkiewicz, Helena Modrzejewska. Her *Lucia of Lammermoor* opened the Metropolitan Opera in 1883 and remained the first MET star for the next twenty-five years. In Europe, she has performed as a soloist in operas in Warsaw, Wrocław, Dresden, Berlin, London, Saint Petersburg and Milan. The director, Radka Franczak, sets out on a film journey in the footsteps of the life of a dazzling diva and great-grandmother – Marcella Sembrich. It is a journey through the artist's fascinating life, four generations, through poverty and wealth, through the enormous development of civilization, the First World War and the political revolution in Russia. Traveling across Europe and America in places with which Marcella is connected the director talks with the rest of Marcella's family, with people who remember her, they store objects or the memory of her voice. On this journey, she is also accompanied by contemporary artists – Patti Smith, Olga Tokarczuk, Waltraud Meyer, Anna Netrebko, Sarah Nemtsov.
